60th Jubilee Celebrations

This past May, two of our Resident priests celebrated their 60th Jubilee of Ordination.

Over the years, Father Eugene Romano served as priest to five



parishes in the Paterson Diocese. Then in 1988, he founded the Hermits of Bethlehem of the Heart of Jesus in Chester New Jersey. Father's Jubilee Mass was held at St. Lawrence the Martyr church near the hermitage in Chester.

Father Thomas Stransky was instrumental in the writing of the 1965 Vatican II document, "Nostra Aetate." He served as president of the Paulist Fathers from 1970 - 1978. Father is also rector emeritus of the Tantur Ecumenical Institute in Jerusalem, a center for theological scholarship. He received an honorary doctorate from the University of Notre Dame. Father Stransky's Jubilee Mass was held at St. Joseph's Home and many of Father's fellow Paulist priests attended and con-celebrated Mass with him. A reception was held following Mass.

We are so blessed to have Father Romano and Father Stransky as part of our family here at St. Joseph's Home.

Sister Rose Is Honored

Since 1980 the Breslin Fund for Seminarians has been hosting the Judge Roger W. Breslin Cornerstone Classic golf outing and dinner. Each year they recognize individuals for their contributions supporting men who are preparing for priesthood. This year our own Sister Rose De St. Raymond, along with Father Martin D. Rooney, M.S.A., were honored for their work in helping seminarians develop the skills that they will need when they begin their pastoral life. Over the last ten years, 150 seminarians from Immaculate Conception Seminary, have benefited from Sister Rose's guidance.

In her acceptance speech, Sister spoke of her work, "Every September, we have the joy and privilege of opening our doors and hearts to welcome a new group of seminarians. While here, they have personal visits with the Residents, experiencing the wisdom of the elderly and also having the opportunity to be at the bedside of the sick and dying. I have joyfully attended many of these as well as their first Masses, which they often choose to be held in our Home."
